

Thought for the Week

Throughout Lent we follow Jesus on his urgent mission to deliver his message to as many as possible before the events awaiting him in Jerusalem. We learn from Luke 13.1 that a group of pilgrims, whilst preparing their sacrifices in the temple, had been massacred by Roman troops acting on Pilate's orders, in keeping with his irrational judgments. It's a story that resonates with us today as we see and read of the atrocities in Ukraine, asking in despair 'Why?'

Luke then recounts Jesus's words of warning that a failure to repent puts us all at risk of a punishing death. Whilst of course today we've moved on from seeing death as a sort of divine retribution, what Luke then writes (13.6-9) can perhaps help us see through the horrors in Ukraine to something far greater and more eternal than the lethal tantrums of a tyrant even more deranged than Pilate.

In Jesus's parable the lifeless fig-tree is threatened with the axe. But, with a little organic help, it comes back to life and fruits for another year. Might this image help raise our spirits? Might it help us to celebrate the cheering stories emerging from the conflict? Might it help reassure us that there'll still be life beyond the current nightmare?

For example.... The 11-year-old boy walking alone for 700 miles out of Ukraine with only a plastic bag for his phone and his mother's phone number on his wrist.... And the father escaping the country with his family, then saying goodbye at the border and going back to fight.... And the 7-year-old girl in a bomb shelter defiantly singing a patriotic song and going viral on social media.... And throughout, the inspiring presence, defiance and words of President Zelensky.

As has always been true, and will be forever, the human spirit is indomitable and will eventually prevail. The resilience of God's people faced with evil, their determination never to yield, their capacity to fight for survival and believe in a future: together these qualities far outweigh any individual's warped purposes.
