


# Thought for the Week

It's not easy reading the bible, no wonder, we are reading ancient documents written over a span of 2,000 years, from different cultures and traditions. Yet as Christians, we are invited to trust in a God transcends time, place and culture and can speak to each one of us here and now in 21st Century Britain.

Perhaps a starting point is to see the bible differently, not as a problem to dissect but as a gift, a treasure waiting to be revealed. To find out what is inside any gift it needs to be opened, then, we take a good long look to savour what has been given.

Lectio divina is a prayful reading of scripture, a way of spending time with the Word of God, reading it slowly and deliberately allowing it to resonate with our hearts and minds, to find meaning beyond the literal text. St Benedict in the 6th Century gave us this way. He saw the scriptures as a gift, to be read over slowly, chew over carefully and savoured in a fourfold rhythm of Listening, Pondering, Praying, and Waiting in this way.

### LISTENING

During the first reading, the passage chosen may be read aloud. Gently look and listen for a word or phrase that attracts or draws your attention.

#### **PONDERING**


During the second reading, (of the same passage), ask yourself how or why this word or phrase has touched your heart, why it is speaking to you at this moment in your life. This is God reaching out to you.

#### **PRAYING**

As you read the passage for the last time, ask God what he may be asking of you. What is it you may need to consider as a result of what God is saying to you in the word or phrase you noticed?

### WAITING

In the quiet that follows the reading allow God to speak to you and plant this word in your heart.



# Here are some verses from Psalm 30, you may like to discover the gift waiting for you to find.

I will exalt you, Lord, for you lifted me out of the depths and did not let my enemies gloat over me. Lord my God, I called to you for help, and you healed me.

You, Lord, brought me up from the realm of the dead; you spared me from going down to the pit.

Sing the praises of the Lord, you his faithful people; praise his holy name.

For his anger lasts only a moment, but his favour lasts a lifetime;

weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning.

Hear, Lord, and be merciful to me;
Lord, be my help."
You turned my wailing into dancing;
you removed my sackcloth and clothed me with joy,
that my heart may sing your praises and not be silent.
Lord my God, I will praise you forever.
