Reflection

Last Sunday was Trinity Sunday and the most popular subject people find hard to explain and to understand.

Trinity - three in one – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Psalm 8 shows us the Father as the creator "When I look to the skies that you have made, when I look at the moon and the stars which you have set in their places – What is mere man that you think of him".

I remember in 1969 being in church hearing this very reading because we were all very proud of ourselves that we had put a man on the moon! But, said the preacher, let us not forget who made the moon and the stars. What is mere man? Well it is you and me and all mankind that God the creator loved so much that he sent his only son Jesus to die for us, to set us free.

If we are made and saved, do we need anything else?

In John 16, Jesus is talking to his disciples before leaving them. He says he has much more to tell them, more than they would be able to understand but, when the Holy Spirit comes, he will lead them into all truth.

The Spirit is the power, the power to help us understand, the power to change our lives. When the disciples received the Spirit at Pentecost, they changed from a frightened bunch of men hiding in an upper room to men rushing out into the street to tell the good news of Jesus to the people of Jerusalem.

It is because this message travelled from Jerusalem to the rest of the world that we are Christians.


