Thought for the week

'I'm still standing...'

Last week – along with over 20,000 others – I was at Carrow Road to see Elton John on the first British leg of his long-running, worldwide Farewell Tour. It was a great evening. The crowd was multigenerational: I was far from the oldest and some entire families had come along together, from grandparents to grandkids. People dressed up: there were sequins and swan feathers in abundance, along with lots of outsize specs! All were invited and encouraged to dance in front of our seats – 'just keep out of the aisles' – and nearly everyone did. Elton and his band were 'joyful', 'majestic', 'triumphant', to quote The Guardian review. As, together, we celebrated the tremendous backcatalogue of hits, so were we all.

And yet, while we enjoyed the nostalgia, we were also aware of some changes, mostly wrought by the passage of time. The stamina involved in delivering a non-stop show of 2.5 hours was considerable but Elton's days of jumping around on stage are long gone. His voice remains strong but he can no longer 'go high'. So, instead, he goes low, sometimes dropping an octave for contrast; or the original musical score is modified to let instruments (eg slide guitars) crescendo as once his voice would have done. It's different – but it works.

In short, he and his band have adjusted. They perform – very impressively – in the spirit of the original, rather than in its exact form because that is no longer practicable. They have gone for 'what works' and they have made it fresh.
