Reflection.....

The news is nothing but bad these days and the world seems full of problems. I looked at each of our readings for this week hopeful for something cheerful or joyful even. What did I find when I looked? Well, quite a lot of anger.

There was a time in my life when I was bombarded by anger every day and I hated it. Is anger ever, right? Can there ever be justice in anger?

Why is God angry in our reading in Jeremiah? God is angry with the prophets whose job it was to tell the people of the good news of God's love for them. To tell the people how God wanted them to live, surely a great privilege. But instead, they are telling the people lies. They are making the people forget God's very name and he is angry.

In Luke again there is more anger. Jesus predicts families falling out with each other and no peace. I found this all very difficult to understand and asked myself why?

As I said at the beginning, I hate anger but I do get angry sometimes myself. I get angry at cruelty. When I see the news and see people weeping over their burnt homes and lost loved ones because of one man's greed for power, I feel angry and helpless. Is there nothing we can do? So much of the news is about injustice and cruelty but the other day I saw an item which made me glad. A giant tortoise had strayed onto the railway line and been injured. A train was held up and the tortoise was rescued and is making a good recovery.


