Harvest ...past, present and future.....

Over the past few weeks in the Hempnall Group we've been holding various Harvest Thanksgiving services, a traditional feature of our church year.

But although we might think of these celebrations as dating from 'time immemorial', in fact, as the Church of England's website tells us:



'Harvest Thanksgiving is a more modern addition to the church calendar. Its origins are usually traced to the adaptation in 1843 of Lammas Day [a much older festival celebrating in early August the first fruits of the wheat harvest] by the Revd R. S. Hawker, a parish priest in Cornwall. He chose the first Sunday in October as a Christian response to coincide with the traditional but largely secular 'harvest home' celebration, [though] there is some evidence to suggest

that a thanksgiving for the harvest was already a relatively widespread practice. An annual church celebration of the harvest certainly established itself rapidly with great popularity and was first recognised officially in the Church of England in 1862.'*

So, it's only 160 years since the practice was formally endorsed in our Anglican churches.

Since then – especially but not solely in rural parishes – it's become an established feature of our worship. It's a popular festival. We decorate our churches and sing joyful songs. A Harvest Thanksgiving is a chance each year to acknowledge our good fortune and be thankful, especially living where we do.

But we shouldn't be complacent. It's also an occasion to challenge ourselves about the use we make of the world's resources - how we can distribute them more fairly, and, even more fundamentally, given the impact of climate change, how we can safeguard and secure them for everyone's future. Harvest Thanksgiving is not just about the past year or the local setting, the 'here and now', important as they are to us - it's an opportunity to look forward and outward, to reflect and pray about the future and the universal.

These themes are further reflected in an even more modern addition to the church calendar, i.e., Creationtide, a period from 1st September to 4th October dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life. Originally an Easter Orthodox initiative in the late C20th, it has increasingly been adopted by most Christian churches in this country over the past two decades.

However we badge our church seasons, let's join, especially at this time of year, in giving thanks for God's gift of creation and let's renew our commitment to caring for our planet.
