## Our daily bread......

We all seem to like bread - to such an extent that it is said, 'If you want to sell your house, make sure a loaf of bread is just coming out of the oven when the viewer arrives.'

It is not surprising that we read so much about it in the Bible, where it is mentioned 360 times. New Testament references include a little boy's lunch, the parable of the man going to his neighbour for bread and, right in the middle of the Lord's Prayer, 'Give us this day our daily bread.' Most importantly, we have the breaking of bread at The Lord's Supper.

Bread was the staple food in Palestine, so basic that everyone would have known what Jesus was talking about. When Jesus said, 'I am the bread of life', he could not have found a more powerful way to explain that he was the source and sustainer of spiritual life. Material bread sustains physical life. Jesus is saying that we shall never find true satisfaction if we focus on that. Jesus is the true bread that comes from heaven. In him we have everything we need in this life and in the life to come.

What a blessing when we can share bread together in communion. I remember some time ago, at a conference, the joy of making bread in the morning and sharing it together in the evening. What a privilege.

We should pay more attention to bread in our everyday lives as this lovely verse suggests:

Be gentle when you touch bread, Let it not lie uncared for, unwanted. So often bread is taken for granted. There is so much beauty in bread, Beauty of sun and soil, beauty of patient toil. Winds and rain have caressed it, Christ so often blessed it; Be gentle when you touch bread.



Rev Nigel Collinson, a Methodist Minister, tells a moving story of receiving a gift at the end of a service in a prison chapel - a small model, beautifully crafted and painted, of a woodland scene, about the size of a paperback. The young man who made it explained that it was made of bread: 'We have five rounds a day and I do not eat them all. So I have made the model out of the bread I did not eat, baked it hard on the pipes that run through my cell, stuck the pieces together, painted them...and it's for you.' Nigel says, 'The model sits on my bookshelves. It is a reminder of daily bread, not thrown away, but changed in strange circumstances by the hidden grace of God.'
