Thoughts of Teresa.....

The Church of England Calendar for October includes an occasion (on the 15th) to mark Teresa of Avila (1515 -1582), 'teacher of the faith'. Teresa – a Spanish noblewoman who became a Carmelite nun – was a powerful proponent of Christian meditation and the contemplative life and she is generally recognised as one of the great Christian mystics.

Her writings continue to have a wide influence. Within the Roman Catholic Church, she was proclaimed by the then Pope in 1970 – centuries after her death – as the first female Doctor of the Church, in recognition of her profound spiritual legacy.

Here are three passages from her works, in modern versions, that still speak to us today.



A call to action

Christ has no body now but yours.

No hands, no feet on earth but yours.

Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world.

Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good.

Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world.

Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

Growing older

Lord, you know better than I myself that I am growing older and will someday be old. Keep me from the fatal habit of thinking I must say something on every subject and on every occasion.

Release me from craving to straighten out everybody's affairs. Make me thoughtful but not moody; helpful but not bossy.


