### Advent Calendars...

A year ago, in writing 'Thoughts and Prayers' for the start of Advent in 2021, I ended with a poem by Rowan Willams, the former Archbishop of Canterbury. This time I make no apologies for starting with it, because it's such a powerful simile about Christ's coming, leading us through Advent to an amazing conclusion:

#### 'Advent Calendar'1

He will come like last leaf's fall.
One night when the November wind
has flayed the trees to bone, and earth
wakes choking on the mould.
the soft shroud's folding.

He will come like frost.

One morning when the shrinking earth opens on mist, to find itself arrested in the net of alien sword-set beauty.

He will come like dark.
One evening when bursting red
December sun draws up the sheet
and penny-masks its eye to yield
the star-snowed fields of sky.

He will come, will come, will come like crying in the night, like blood, breaking, as the earth writhes to toss him free He will come like child.



Another Archbishop – the current Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell – has also produced an Advent Calendar in 'Let It Slow', his little book of fun observations and practical ideas, in which he responds to '...the imagined voice of the sort of frazzled and fragmented person that many of us become at Christmas' with brief reflections and suggestions on 'how to make sense of this and start sorting things out'.<sup>2</sup> The clue is in the title.

Very different in style, tone and focus, both of these Archbishop-authored Calendars encourage us to engage properly and fully with Advent, so that we are prepared not just materially but spiritually for what happens next.

So, let's make the most of Advent: let's try to find time and space to be aware, to stop for a moment, to be still, watchful and receptive – and to be confident that God is coming, 'like child'. In the words of the Advent prayer: 'Maranatha' – 'Our Lord, come'. (1 Corinthians 16.22).
