## Thought for the week...

There are many ways to read the bible. Cover to cover, book by book, chapter by chapter or just sitting with a particular passage that seems to resonate and connect with your experience.

One way of reading, is to do so slowly, thoughtfully, reading the passage again and seeing what phrase or verse stands out, then, staying with that verse or phrase, ask God what he may be saying and then just wait for his response.

This way of praying the bible has a long tradition first established by Benedict of Nursia in the 6th century. It is called Lectio Divina:

Try reading these verses this way:

## Listening

During the first reading, gently look and listen for a word or phrase that attracts or draws your attention.

#### **Pondering**

During the second reading, ask yourself how or why does this word or phrase has touched your heart, why it is speaking to you at this moment in your life.

## **Praying**

As you read the passage for the last time, ask God what he may be asking of you. What is it you may need to consider as a result of what God is saying to you in the word or phrase you noticed?

#### Waiting

In the quiet that follows the reading allow God to speak to you and plant this word in your heart.



## Psalm 40

- I waited patiently for the Lord; he turned to me and heard my cry.
- He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand.
- 3 He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear the Lord and put their trust in him.
- 4 Blessed is the one
  who trusts in the Lord,
  who does not look to the proud,
  to those who turn aside to false gods.
- 5 Many, Lord my God,
  are the wonders you have done,
  the things you planned for us.
  None can compare with you;
  were I to speak and tell of your deeds,
  they would be too many to declare.
- Sacrifice and offering you did not desire –
  but my ears you have opened; –
  burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not require.
- 7 Then I said, 'Here I am, I have come it is written about me in the scroll.
- 8 I desire to do your will, my God; your law is within my heart.'
- I proclaim your saving acts in the great assembly;
  I do not seal my lips, Lord,
  as you know.
- I do not hide your righteousness in my heart;
   I speak of your faithfulness and your saving help.
   I do not conceal your love and your faithfulness from the great assembly.
- Do not withhold your mercy from me, Lord; may your love and faithfulness always protect me.
- For troubles without number surround me;
  my sins have overtaken me, and I cannot see.
  They are more than the hairs of my head,
  and my heart fails within me.
