Candlemas...

Throughout Epiphanytide, as we noted in our 'Thought' last week, we've been hearing of the various ways in which Christ's glory became apparent and was recognised by others in his early life. We've noted, too, the imagery of 'light' in that process.

Now this Sunday we shall read again the story of 'The Presentation of Christ in the Temple' (to give the festival its full title) where the elderly Simeon cradles the infant Jesus as:

> 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel' (Luke 2:32)

before predicting to Mary the child's destiny and her own future suffering.

The feast of The Presentation is thus associated with 'light'. Hence its now common name of 'Candlemas' and the custom which developed of blessing church candles, with prayers that those who see them will themselves be aware of the light of Christ.

As we prepare to celebrate Candlemas, here is a poem based on this week's Gospel reading about Christ's Presentation:
