Jesus and the Samaritan Woman...

The story of Jesus and the Samaritan woman has always been one of my favourites, as when we lived at Fritton we had a well in our sitting room.

Since we don't often drink from wells in this country you might feel this is not a very up-to-date story, but you would be wrong. Because this story is not so much about water as it is about discrimination. We all know from the news today what a problem this still is in our world.

In the Gospel story we find Jesus, hot and tired sitting by the well when a woman arrives all by herself with her water jar. You might think there is nothing unusual in that but normally women came to the well together and certainly not in the heat of the day. As she saw Jesus, she expected nothing from him and she must have been surprised when he spoke. She was a woman and a Samaritan and obviously shunned by her society (she was alone). For a Jewish man to speak to her was amazing, for him to ask for a drink from her was even more amazing.

As Christians we do our best to help people. But occasionally letting someone do something for us can be even more valuable. Jesus made the Samaritan woman feel useful. She may have thought, "He is a stranger; he doesn't know what I am like", but Jesus did know. He began to talk to this lonely woman and then the sad story came out. She had had five husbands and the man she was living with now was not her husband. She was shunned by the other women because she was considered immoral. Shunned by the Jews because she was a Samaritan and looked down upon because she was a woman.



Sadly, even today women are still marginalised, ethnic communities are still persecuted and judgements made about people when we do not have enough knowledge of the situation to be fair.

Jesus offers this woman life-giving water which will be so refreshing that she will never be thirsty again. Jesus is talking of the living water that is the Holy Spirit. When Gods living water flowed into her heart it washed away the hurt and the shame and she could go to the well with the other women, she could be part of her community again, she didn't need to be alone. Here is a Jewish man who values her enough to ask for her help. Here is a Jewish man who tells her that God loves and forgives her.

The bible then tells us that she leaves her water jar and rushes into town: this woman - who crept to the well on her own - runs into town telling everyone, "I have met a man, he told me all about myself: can he be the Messiah?"

I don't know how your life is today - only God knows but so many of us have been hurt, so many of us have sorrows or regrets. I hope today that the living water will sweep through us and heal us and bubble up, overflow and reach out to those around us.
