Jesus prays...

Chapters 16 and 17 of John's Gospel, describing the farewell prayers of Jesus, are two wonderful passages to read, especially as we approach Holy Week. His public preaching was over, his work with the disciples finished. Jesus knew his hour had come, the hour of his passion, his trial, crucifixion and rejection.

Pouring his heart and soul out to his Father in heaven, he prayed for himself, his disciples and those that would follow. He had finished the work God gave him to do. He had tried many times before to prepare the disciples for what lay ahead, both for himself and them. They seemed to find it difficult to grasp: maybe it was too painful to take in. They had walked and talked with Jesus for three years and they probably couldn't deal with the thought of separation. Try to imagine how they felt when Jesus looked up to Heaven to pray for them. As they listened to Jesus praying they would have known that he was bringing them into his Father's presence. He presented them to his Father with joy and thanks and asked his Father to keep them safe. Whilst it was a wonderful experience for them, they knew there was no turning back. They would have experienced all sorts of emotions: the sadness and pain of parting, the fear of the unknown and perhaps a sense of being overwhelmed with the task that lay ahead.

Those friends of Jesus had yet to discover the power of the Holy Spirit that they had been promised. It would guide them, comfort them and help them to preach the Gospel. Jesus had chosen them, but he knew there would be times when they would fail him, they would doubt him, they would run away - but only for a time. Jesus wanted them to know he would still love them: the world would do its worse, but nothing could separate them from his Father, who was also their Father.

When Jesus had finished praying for the disciples, he then prayed for all who believed in him. Jesus was praying for all. That means we are all included. Those disciples were ordinary people just like us. Jesus chose them to continue his work: we also have been chosen. I think we can relate to those disciples, albeit in a lesser way, as we move forward in the new benefice: we may fear change, there can be nervousness of moving forward, but there will also be excitement of what God has planned. God is in control. We do not have to do this alone. Just as the disciples had the promise of the Holy Spirit, so do we.

Jesus said ask and you will receive. In his prayer Jesus asks that we may be of the same mind so that we might be able to complete the work. Those disciples were just the same as us, they had to work together, adapt to change. I think that it is wonderful that with the Cross being only hours away, Jesus was still thinking of others.

After this prayer with his disciples Jesus went into the garden, the garden of Gethsemane. As we journey to the cross again with all its pain, let us give thanks for the privilege of serving him and the knowledge that he still intercedes for each one of us.
