But perhaps one of the advantages of 'being on holiday' – an experience which many of us will be hoping to enjoy in the coming month – is that, with a more flexible itinerary, we can actively choose picturesque byways, taking time to stop and appreciate the views which normally we're speeding past. We may set out sometimes spontaneously on a whim, without knowing our precise destination. It can be liberating.

Whether or not we do that when 'away', we should perhaps deliberately try to slow down sometimes in our normal environment and take 'time out', even if just for a few moments, to look around us and explore, more consciously and adventurously, wherever we are. It's so easy to be caught up in our 'busy-ness' and to miss out on noticing – and taking inspiration from – the place we're in.
