Thought for the month...

There seems to have been a lot of sport around recently with football and tennis and then the Olympics started in Paris on the 26th July. Not to mention much closer to home, the local cricket



and bowls clubs. All those taking part in whatever their sport, training hard to make sure they are in peak condition, ready to go out there, do their best, perhaps even win.

With all this sport around I was reminded of St Pauls letter to the Corinthians where he wrote: *Surely you know that many runners take part in a race, but only one of them will win a prize. Run then, in such a way as to win the prize.* An interesting lesson for all those taking part in any sport. Do try your hardest, train for the event, have your sights set on winning but it is taking part that is most important – not everyone or every team can win – but just by taking part I believe you are a winner. You have trained, you have persevered and you have done your best. But of course you do all the training to aim to win.

The Bible uses running metaphors in various contexts to convey spiritual and moral lessons. In the letter to the Corinthians, the apostle Paul employs the imagery of a race to highlight the importance of perseverance and discipline in the Christian life. This passage encourages believers to approach their Christian journey with purpose, discipline, and the goal of an eternal reward. Pauls lesson for the Corinthian Christians is a lesson for us all.

In all walks of life we should always persevere to do our best at whatever it is. It may be at work, at play, when volunteering, when taking up new hobbies. We do need to persevere, to do our best, and there will be times when we need to ask for help. All top athletes and sports stars have trainers to help them achieve their best, to help them attain their goal. Christians also ask for help, often in the form of prayer or spiritual guidance from a friend or professional.
