Remember...

I reflect on my parents, remembering how I was



brought up, what skills they gave me and how they prepared me for adult life. I also remember good friends who have passed away leaving a 'hole' in my life. On Sunday 3rd November the churches in the Brooke Benefice and Hempnall Group will be holding commemoration services. This is to link it with All Souls Day which is commemorated on Saturday 2nd November, when we set aside a day to remember the departed, those parents, family members, and friends no longer with us. The services will be reflective with a chance to light a candle of remembrance.

The following Sunday is Remembrance Sunday, remembering those who lost their lives in the world wars and conflicts since.
