## ***Canticle***

### *A Song of God's Children*

The law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus  
has set us free from the law of sin and death.

All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God;  
for we have received the Spirit that enables us to cry, 'Abba, Father'.

The Spirit himself bears witness that we are children of God  
and if God's children, then heirs of God;

If heirs of God, then fellow-heirs with Christ;  
since we suffer with him now, that we may be glorified with him.

These sufferings that we now endure  
are not worth comparing to the glory that shall be revealed.

For the creation waits with eager longing  
for the revealing of the children of God.

**Glory to the Father and to the Son  
and to the Holy Spirit;  
as it was in the beginning is now  
and shall be for ever.**

### ***The Word of God***

#### **First reading - Psalm 7, verses 1:10**

##### *Plea for deliverance from enemies*

O Lord my God, in you I take refuge;  
save me from all my pursuers, and deliver me,  
or like a lion they will tear me apart;  
they will drag me away, with no one to rescue.

O Lord my God, if I have done this,  
if there is wrong in my hands,  
if I have repaid my ally with harm  
or plundered my foe without cause,  
then let the enemy pursue and overtake me,  
trample my life to the ground,  
and lay my soul in the dust.

Rise up, O Lord, in your anger;  
lift yourself up against the fury of my enemies;  
awake, O my God; you have appointed a judgement.  
Let the assembly of the peoples be gathered around you,  
and over it take your seat on high.  
The Lord judges the peoples;  
judge me, O Lord, according to my righteousness  
and according to the integrity that is in me.

O let the evil of the wicked come to an end,  
but establish the righteous,  
you who test the minds and hearts,  
O righteous God.  
God is my shield,  
who saves the upright in heart.

This is the word of the Lord.

## **Second Reading – The Gospel of Mark, Chapter 10, verses 35-45**

### *The Request of James and John*

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you'. And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory'. But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptised with the baptism that I am baptised with?' They replied, 'We are able'. Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptised, you will be baptised; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared'.

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognise as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many'.

This is the word of the Lord.
