





COVID 19 SPRING BOOSTER CAMPAIGN

Here at the Practice, we are continuing with our involvement with the vaccination campaign to help with the delivery of the spring booster. This booster is being offered as a precaution to those at extremely high risk of complications caused by Covid 19.

You can book a booster with us if you are 75 years and over (including anyone who turns 75 by 30th June 2022).

At the time of writing this article (06.04.22) it is recommended that you should wait until around 6 months since your last dose of vaccine for maximum effectiveness.

If you are 12 years and over and Immunocompromised, you are eligible for the spring booster if there has been at least three months from your previous dose. However, as we will be delivering the Moderna vaccine those aged 12-18 will need to access the Pfizer vaccine through the mass vaccination centres.

If you are feeling unwell please wait until you have recovered to have your vaccine, please do not attend a vaccine appointment if you are waiting for the result of a Covid 19 test. If you contract Covid 19 please wait until at least 4 weeks before having your spring booster.

The Garden in May - Summer's on its way....

As bulbs fade and herbaceous borders grow in leaps and bounds, it is now a clear sign that summer is approaching. Sowing and planting out bedding can begin, depending on regional weather variations, and you can take softwood cuttings. It's also time to get back into the lawn mowing regime, as the lawn will be loving the warmer temperatures this month brings.



- 1. Watch out for late frosts. Protect tender plants.**
- 2. Earth up potatoes, and promptly plant any still remaining.** Potato plants need 'earthing up' as they grow, to protect early shoots from frost damage and ensure the developing potatoes aren't exposed to light, which turns them green and poisonous.
- 3. Plant out summer bedding at the end of the month (except in cold areas).** Bedding plants provide a temporary decorative seasonal display for beds, borders, containers and hanging baskets.
- 4. Water early and late to get the most out of your water, recycle water when possible.**



- 5. Regularly hoe off weeds.**
- 6. Open greenhouse vents and doors on warm days.**



- 7. Mow lawns weekly – but consider leaving some areas uncut for wildlife.**
- 8. Check for nesting birds before clipping hedges.**



- 9. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring-flowering bulbs.**
- 10. Watch out for viburnum beetle and lily beetle grubs**

Thought for the month...

Hello Everyone,

In June we celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. On the 21st April 1947 at the young age of 25 years the Princess Elizabeth, as she was then, said these words:

"I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service... But I shall not have strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in it with me, as I now invite you to do: I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it."

At her coronation the Queen was to make solemn promises, vows, to rule and govern according to the law, to exercise justice with mercy in all her judgments, the peoples of the United Kingdom and Commonwealth and to maintain the Laws of God and the true profession of the Gospel. Aware of the enormity of the task ahead, she asked of her people on her Coronation Day, on 2nd June 1953:

"When I spoke to you last... I asked you all, whatever your religion, to pray for me on the day of my Coronation - to pray that God would give me wisdom and strength to carry out the promises that I should then be making... I have been uplifted and sustained by the knowledge that your thoughts and prayers were with me."



There is a sacred moment at the heart of the coronation ceremony, hidden from camera when all symbols of royal status are removed. The Queen, dressed in a simple white dress with no jewels or crowns is anointed with oil on her hands, breast and forehead, by the Archbishop. The sacrament of anointing is an outward sign of an inner meaning. That God's love, strength and wisdom will fill her whole being to live out the promises made in faithful loving service.

Gracious God, we give you thanks for the reign of your servant Elizabeth our Queen, and for the example of loving and faithful service which she has shown among us. Help us to follow her example of dedication and commit our lives to you and one another, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
