Some good news from the practice. We have a new salaried GP, Dr Thomas Watchman joining us from the 12th of May. # The Garden in June....

### Summer arrives

June 21 is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth encourages the garden to put on an exuberant burst of growth. But this extra light and warmth also means weeds will sprout up from seemingly nowhere. Keep on top of them by hoeing regularly in dry conditions.



- 1. **Position summer hanging baskets and containers outside.** Choose vibrant bedding plants for a short-term show or herbs, shrubs and evergreens for a long-lasting display.
- 2. **Be water-wise, especially in drought-affected areas.** Watering is key to growing plants well, so here we look at how to get it just right. This not only means providing the water our gardens need, but using it wisely.
- 3. **Pinch out side-shoots on tomatoes.** Removing the sideshoots is simple – every time



you water, check the plant for any shoots sprouting just above each leaf, from the joint between the leaf and the stem.



- 4. Harvest lettuce, radish, other salads and early potatoes
- 5. Hoe borders regularly to keep down weeds
- Mow lawns at least once a week
  but consider leaving some areas uncut for wildlife
- 7. Plant out summer bedding
- 8. Stake tall or floppy plants
- 9. Prune many spring-flowering shrubs
- 10. Shade greenhouses to keep them cool and prevent scorch

# Thought for the month...

Hello Everyone,

Eight good things that came to mind whilst travelling, in a vintage bus, around the Hempnall Group last month.

Woodton, there is a Community Wood behind the Village Hall. A wonderful space for all ages to enjoy wildlife and the beauty of natural habitats. You will find benches to sit on to look and listen, with wheelchair friendly pathways. It is well used by the school and residents alike. A hidden gem of a place to enjoy the wonder of God's creation.



Bedingham, there were originally two churches in Bedingham. In 1159 Benedict de Bedingham was the first Rector of St Mary's and in 1205 John de Brancastre was Rector of St Andrews. What happened to St Mary's is uncertain, but what is certain, is that for 805 years this building has been open for all. The stones seem to have absorbed the prayers and praises offered here down the centuries which are almost tangible to those who visit this quiet, light filled space today.

**Topcroft**, it was from here that the first Valentine's card was sent by Margery Brews from Topcroft Hall to her fiancée John Paston of Norfolk in February 1477. She described John as her "right well-beloved valentine". This and other letters are recorded in what is known as The Paston letters. How wonderful it is to receive a letter, then and now. *https://www.bl.uk/ collection-items/valentines-day-loveletter-from-margery-brews-to-johnpaston* 

Hardwick, in 1340 a hospital was founded in the parish. It was dedicated to St Lazarus and possibly devoted to the care of lepers, as many were in medieval times. That same concern and care for people, especially those on the edges of society still continues in our Group of Parishes. How grateful we are in our own time for our NHS.

**Shelton**, living at Shelton Hall, Sir John and Lady Shelton took responsibility for the Princess Elizabeth, (later to become Elizabeth I) after her mother Anne Boleyn was executed. These were dangerous times. It is reputed that on one occasion Sir John hid the young princess in Shelton church tower, a place of sanctuary, where she avoided arrest. Many are seeking sanctuary and safety in our world today. We give thanks for Queen Elizabeth II's 70 year reign.

Morningthorpe, the Doomsday book records there were two manors, one being Boyland Manor belonging to Ralph Bainard a Norman baron. The hall was demolished in 1947, but a large Anglo-Saxon (410-1066AD) cemetery was discovered to the west of the hall in 1974. A place to remember our loved ones who have died has been, and always will be important. and our children to enjoy. Let us make sure that other habitats in our county and around the world fare as well.

**Hempnall**, in 1979 the the Mill was converted into a social centre for the village. It remains a place where support and the enjoyment each other is found. Owned and run by The Hempnall Trust, a long establishes village charity, it reminds us of the faithfulness and generosity of people who continue to give of themselves and their time for the good of others.

It's a joy and privilege to live in such wonderful villages each with their own unique story to tell. We add to that story with the way we live and care for each other now.
