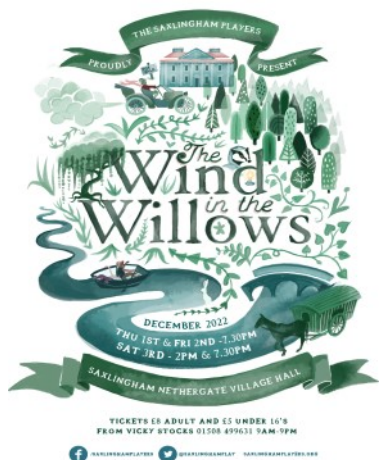

Remembering your Faithful Friend this Christmas

Christmas may be a time to remember family and friends - but Dogs Trust Snetterton is also asking local dog owners to remember their four-legged friends this festive time, with a *Canine Care Card*.

The *Canine Care Card* is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a life-changing diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.

It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for '*Canine Care Card*' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed, loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.

- Have the team worked above and beyond, gone out of their way to do their absolute best, worked through isolations, sickness, serious personal difficulties with bereavements and family issues – YES

I am proud of every single one of our team for keeping going when they could so easily have voted with their feet and left the NHS. Most importantly – we care – we care so much that when things do go wrong – or we read negative posts on social media when sat at home with our families – it hurts. We too are human beings. We too have issues with our morale. We too feel overwhelmed by the sheer volume of demand that is pouring down on us. We too go home in the evening and have sleepless nights thinking about that person who was upset, shouted at us, sometimes made us cry at work when our hands are tied by the system or the lack of appointments. Do we want to ask “Is it an emergency for today?” – NO we don’t – but if there is no other way – what do we do?

I have got to say that this year has been the toughest of my 5 years in post for many reasons, far harder than the two COVID years, because this year has been about trying to get back to some normality, while facing the highest levels of demand ever.

I really don’t want to sound negative, because it is not, but I would just like to tap into some of that festive spirit out there to say – do you know what, there is a huge population out there who really do appreciate what we have done, and are trying to do. I would like to celebrate the fact that our overwhelming positive feedback on Friends & Family responses makes us feel valued by the majority. We have a real unity at LSMP that I have never seen or found in any other workplace. That unity is led by our GP Partners and it permeates throughout the whole team, and I, for one, am proud to say that LSMP does its level best to provide a Primary Care service to you, our patients.

Looking forward into 2023 I am positive that our development plans giving 7 extra clinical rooms and car park extension etc. will start to alleviate some of our problems. It will be an exciting year and we will try to keep any disruption to a minimum. Please bear with us, we are building for the future.

We would like to wish all our patients a Happy and Healthy Christmas & New Year! Please come down and join us on Wednesday 21st December from 2pm when we will have members of the Salvation Army with us again bringing some traditional festive cheer.

Finally at the end of January we have **Candlemas**, commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple.
