Cervical screening awareness week 19th - 24th June 2023

In a previous issue, I spoke about the importance of cervical screening in women. In June, a week is specially dedicated to cervical screening awareness, and I felt I had to add something on this topic again. In January this year, NHS England published a news article on their website on this topic and the introductory paragraph was quite scary! It read "The NHS has issued a call for anyone eligible for cervical screening to come forward for a potentially life-saving appointment, with nearly a third, around 4.6 million, not taking up their latest test. The plea from senior NHS medics comes on the back of the health service sending a record number of invites for cervical screening in the last year, as part of its ambition to eradicate the cancer through a combination of vaccination and early identification.'

Once again, a reminder about cervical screening. Cervical screening is offered to all women and people with a cervix between the ages of 25 and 64. A letter is sent from NHS England inviting you to make an appointment. If patients do not attend their screening their GP surgery is informed, as a safety net, we take over their care and send a further invitation.

Based on our current searches these are the numbers of our patients that are currently overdue their cervical screening:

- Patients aged 25 to 34 = 135
- Patients aged 35 to 49 = 223
- Patients aged 50 to 65 = 291
- 354 of patients are currently HPV positive and have not responded to follow up requests

I encourage you to take up this screening if you are eligible, raise awareness in your family and friends circle and help in the eradication of this cancer.

Thought for the Month.....

Dear Friends,

Have you ever wondered why God created wasps? I have, every time one has hijacked a picnic or brought his friends to make a nest around the house. Whilst they might be fiendish creatures, they do, of course, have an important place in our environment and feast on all sorts of pests who would destroy our plants and fruit otherwise.



The creation story in the Bible tells us that each time God created something "he saw that it was good". We are surrounded by that good creation to this day. Whether it be the beauty of an open vista with blue sky and swaying corn fields, the produce of our gardens and greenhouses, both personal and commercial, or the grace and intelligence of the animals and birds with whom we share the planet - all provide us with cause to celebrate and praise their maker.

The 5th June this year is World Environment Day and the focus is on plastic. I wonder if God wonders why he allowed humans to discover and make the stuff? Without doubt it can be "good" and has made a huge difference to our lives, but it is also destroying our world. It is estimated that between 19 and 23 million tonnes of used plastic enters our seas, rivers and waterways each year; a threat to

animals and to human life.

There are so many terrible things happening in our world that we feel helpless to do anything about - but here is something we can change. Can you reduce the amount of single-use plastic that passes through your household? Why not use 5th June as a starting point and see if you can re-use or re-cycle just one extra piece of plastic each week? When you shop, can you choose things with less plastic packaging? If we all do it, manufacturers will soon get the message.

God created a wonderful world and gave it into our care. Let's see if we can do our bit to ensure that those who come after us can also look at their environment and see that "it was very good".

New Benefice Vision Day.....

On 29th April members of the Hempnall Group and the Brooke Benefice came together at Ditchingham Village Hall to spend time together and to consider their vision for the new benefice they are being asked to become.

It was a beautiful sunny day and those who attended enjoyed spending time getting to know one another, including for many eating lunch outside. Thanks to all who baked cakes and biscuits – and to the washing up team.

We were able to worship together as we set the day in the context of prayer and shared in Holy Communion.

During the day we thought about the treasures that each benefice brings to the new benefice and considered these in the light of the "Five Marks of Mission" which define the Church. We were overjoyed by the riches we discovered we have and interested to see how these mapped onto the Five Marks. Moving on, we considered "What Three Words" we would like people to say about our churches and congregations – "welcoming" and "friendly" were the top two and will be high on the agenda as we plan for the future.

After lunch participants were invited to choose from a wide range of concerns and to express their thoughts, ideas and questions, or to discuss them with others. This activity produced a bank of ideas and opinions which will inform the direction of the new benefice. Subjects included: eco-matters, music, communication, learning, finance and church buildings, among others. Time was spent discussing a name for the new benefice. A shortlist of the many suggestions sent in by community members was considered in greater depth, along with thinking about the theological significance of names. Having gathered everyone's thoughts these will be taken to the PCCs of the two benefices who will make the final decision about which name is submitted to the Archdeacon.

We finished the day by considering what we feel God may be calling us to be like as a new benefice and sharing these ideas with one another. No definitive answer was reached but as we plan now we will be able to look back at these thoughts and see if the practical things we intend to do fit in with them. This was a wonderful day which made a really good beginning to our life together as the new benefice.
