Serving the community

Borderhoppa, a registered not for profit charity, provides a range of community services to more than 50 parishes in south Norfolk and north Suffolk – including those in Diss, Harleston, Long Stratton, Eye, Stradbroke and surrounding parishes.

We are looking for more volunteer drivers and trustees to support our vital community transport service. Tom Clarke, Borderhoppa manager, said "Our services really do provide a lifeline for some of the most vulnerable people in our community so anyone who can help us would be making a positive contribution to local life. If you have some spare time and would be interested in helping us we would love to hear from you".

Volunteers would be trained to occasionally drive the groups minibuses for it's much used outings service. We run many popular, weekly outings for members throughout the year including trips to the coast, garden centres, pub lunches, shopping trips and boat trips. Our door to door dial-a-ride service allows people of all ages without access to other forms of transport – including those with restricted mobility and the rurally isolated – to carry out everyday tasks such as shopping, attend GP appointments, visit friends and relatives or to attend a local club/community group.

If you are a member of a local not for profit community group, you can hire the minibuses for outings. Go to destinations of your choice, visit your favourite places and enjoy shopping trips.

Help Save Lives

We are fortunate enough to have two emergency defibrillators in the Hempnall parish, one on the outside of Hempnall Village Hall and the other in the phone box at the junction of The Street and B1527.

These are now funded by the parish council, however a volunteer is required to carry out monthly inspections of the units. This generally takes about 5 minutes per unit, so is not onerous but is a vital service to the community.

Welcome to our Spring 2024 Newsletter.

King's Head Pub – Great things are happening at the King's Head! The Roti II restaurant is proving very popular and with regular Pub Quiz Nights, Musical Evenings and much more this is becoming the place to be. So please continue to support this valuable village asset as much as possible – Open every day except Tuesdays.

Development – There is currently little to report on the new proposed 50 house development off Church Road until plans go before the Management Committee in either April or May 2024. However, we are in regular contact with the Planning Officer discussing the concerns raised by Norfolk County Council Highways, the Lead Flood Authority, design of the houses and also those of local residents. But we are keeping a watchful eye on all matters relating to this important issue.





Flooding & Reclaim the Rain — You can read more detail of the Reclaim the Rain project on our website, https://woodtonpc.wixsite.com/woodtonpc. but with the added challenges posed by a very wet winter and conversely dry summers and the effect of climate change, this continues to be a very important issue here in Woodton. The Street has, yet again, experienced near dangerous scenarios and we are constantly raising our concerns with the local Flood Management teams.

Community Wood

- The visit by Father Christmas, presents for all the children, with food and drinks afterwards, was attended by a huge number of people and has now become very much part of Christmas in Woodton.
- Easter to follow shortly with the Wood decorated and an Easter Egg Hunt so keep your eyes open for more details.
- Security Cameras will shortly be installed in several location thanks to funding from our District Councillor's Member's Grant. Thank you Chris for supporting our application.
- Planting A grant of £300.00 was awarded to the Wood as part of the Clean Up & Bloom scheme and this will greatly help boost our planting plan for the coming year.
- Bark Spreading, Growing Area & Other Tasks Thank you to everyone who has
 taken part in the regular bark spreading sessions, helping with the growing
 area or the general upkeep of our Wood. This is an on-going task and there is
 always more to do!







Footpath Clearance & Litter Picks – The Footpath and Bridleway on the B1332 near the school and opposite The Street has now been cleared by our team of willing volunteers making it much easier for walkers to enjoy. We combined this with a Village Litter Pick and general weeding session by the school gate and car park entrance.



Gardening in April...

Sunshine and showers

Spring is finally in evidence as daffodils and flowering trees start to bloom. Expect the inevitable April showers this month but with sunny days too, when you can turn your attention to the lawn. It's an exciting month,



with indoor-sown seeds well into growth, and it's also time to start sowing outdoors. Just watch out for frosts...

Top gardening jobs this month

1.Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wild flower seed outdoors

Sowing seeds outdoors is an easy, inexpensive and fun way to grow new plants. It's ideal for a wide range of hardy flowers and vegetables.





2. Protect fruit blossom from late frosts

Most top fruit and soft fruit are very hardy but once they start into growth in spring, flowers and buds are especially vulnerable to frost and may need protection to crop well.

3. Tie in climbing and rambling roses Rose pruning ensures that plants grow

vigorously and flower well each year. Although often considered complicated, rose pruning is not difficult if you follow this guide.



More jobs for this month

- 1. Keep weeds under control
- 2. Start to feed citrus plants
- 3. Increase the water given to houseplants
- 4. Feed hungry shrubs and roses

- 5. Sow new lawns or repair bare patches
- 6. Prune fig trees
- 7. Divide bamboos and waterlilies

Thought for the month...

MUD

Mud, mud, glorious mud Nothing quite like it for cooling the blood....



Well, there's plenty around just now. We encountered an abundance on a recent Sunday when the Group walk took us across the fields between Hempnall and Saxlingham and round the Redwings paddocks. There was one particularly difficult kissing gate where there was some very squelchy mud which had to be negotiated. There was inevitably a slowing of progress, time for those behind to catch up, to draw breath and to talk to one another.

However, as we know, mud has other uses. It is the vital constituent for mud baths and of course covers up whatever roughness is occurring under the surface. This can be hazardous sometimes or on other occasions helpful.

It is also a side product of rain which although often not welcome is an essential we need to supply water to drink and to grow our crops.

In life we often smooth over situations with a little bit of mud equivalent, or let matters surface more gently at intervals as we or others are more able to cope with them.

There may be times when we don't make enough of this use of mud as a cure.

In the month of April ahead, as the fields and our gardens dry out we will enjoy the green-ness that results from all this wet and will begin to see our seeds germinating.

And it will be a pleasure not to come home with boots caked in mud!

In the meantime let's make the most of the mud, even if we don't leap in with an ear-splitting splosh as the hippopotamuses did.

And, as we do, let's celebrate again the variety, the wonder and the glory of the whole of creation. We ask for God's blessing as we head into spring:

May the rains sweep gentle across our land, May the sun warm the soil, May every good seed bear fruit, And summer find us in fields of plenty...
