We are into 2024! And experiencing a cold winter. Wrap up warm, stay active and stay safe from the numerous viruses that are characteristic of the time of year. The pandemic finally ended and we remember with sadness those that lost their lives to COVID19.

In this first article of the year, I want to discuss one of our important patient reviews. This is the Cancer Care review appointment that we offer our patients with cancer ideally within three months of the initial diagnosis. This is one of our patient objectives recommended by the quality and outcome framework. However, I see this appointment as crucial whether face to face or as a telephone appointment and many of my GP colleagues will agree with me. In the early months after a diagnosis of cancer, patients are looked after in every way by the hospital teams and as a GP, I have a very limited role. The Cancer Care review appointment gives us the opportunity to talk to a patient going through a very difficult phase in his/her life.

The Macmillan Cancer support website defines clearly a Cancer Care review:

A Cancer Care Review (CCR) is a conversation between a patient and a Health or Social Care professional about their experience with cancer. It is essential to personalise care and helps patients to:

- *talk about their cancer experience and concerns*
- *understand what support is available in their community*
- *receive the information they need to begin supported self-management.*

My request is that if you have not had a call from your GP in those early months, it might be due to delay in paperwork and the associated logistics. Please do not hesitate to ring Reception and request an appointment with your GP or a clinician. We understand the sensitivity and emotional turmoil that can accompany such a diagnosis and it is important to remember that your GP practice can support, and sign post you to appropriate services.

# GARDENING IN FEBRUARY

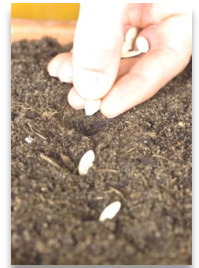
## *Spring is in sight*

This month there are signs of the approaching spring, with bulbs appearing and wildlife waking up as light levels and temperatures increase. There's plenty to do indoors this month to prepare for the season ahead. Outdoors, as the garden comes to life again, it's time to prune shrubs and climbers, such as *Wisteria* as well as



### **1. Prepare vegetable seed beds, and sow some vegetables under cover**

Knowing which vegetables to sow where, when and how means you can maintain constant supplies throughout the season.



### **2. Chit potato tubers**

It's important with earlies, and a good idea with maincrops, to 'chit' the seed potatoes before planting. This means allowing them to start sprouting shoots.

### **3. Protect blossom on apricots, nectarines and peaches**

Most top fruit and soft fruit are very hardy but once they start into growth in spring, flowers and buds are especially vulnerable to frost and may need protection to crop well.



## **More jobs for this month**

4. Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep the birds off
5. Prune winter-flowering shrubs that have finished flowering
6. Divide bulbs such as snowdrops, and plant those that need planting 'in the green'
7. Prune *Wisteria*
8. Prune hardy evergreen hedges and renovate overgrown deciduous hedges
9. Prune conservatory climbers such as *bougainvillea*
10. Cut back deciduous grasses left uncut over the winter, remove dead grass from evergreen grasses

## Thought for the month...

Dear Friends,

The feast of Candlemas at the opening of February marks an ending and a beginning. In a special service filled with light we look back forty days to Christmas and the birth of Jesus, and forward to the coming of Lent and Easter when we remember his self-



sacrificing death and joyful resurrection. Within the space of an hour, in words, music and silence we recognise the joys and sorrows of human life and allow these to be illuminated by the light of God.

This letter also marks an ending and a beginning and carries with it those contrasting joys and sorrows that we all experience. As many of you will know, I am going to be leaving the Hempnall Group (and my other work as Rural Dean of Depwade and Vicar of the Brooke Benefice) and moving across the county to become the Rector of Hethersett. Although my time with you has been short I can look back with gratitude and thanksgiving at all the things we've done together in the time that I have been here, and with some sorrow that the time has come to move on before I've really got to know you properly. I am, however, looking forward to the new people and challenges that God is calling me to.

The current times are uncertain ones for our parish churches as numbers attending services decline, finances get tight and the care and attention needed by our communities and our beautiful buildings increases. It is really important to remember that our churches and their work belong to everyone in our villages, and anyone who wants to help keep them alive is welcome to be involved. Having a resident priest can be encouraging and helpful, but it is the local community who make churches thrive. I shall continue to keep the people of the Hempnall Group in my prayers long after I've moved to pastures new. I am sure that God will call a new priest to work with you in due course, but meanwhile I encourage you to pull together to support and maintain the life of our churches - they are an important gift to our communities.



I hope that many of you will join me in celebrating my time in the local area on **Sunday 18th February**, which will be my last day. At **10.30am** there will be a service of **Holy Communion** at **Hempnall Church**, to which all are welcome. This will be followed by **tea and cake** in **Brooke Village Hall** from **3-5pm** that afternoon and you are invited to drop in and share memories or say farewell. The day will conclude at **6.30pm** with a celebratory **Service of Thanksgiving** in **St Peter's Church, Brooke**, where I was licenced in October 2014. Everyone is invited.

Thank you all for your warm welcome to the Hempnall Group. You will be much in my thoughts and prayers in the weeks and months to come.
