Flood Prevention

It is pleasing to report that the winter passed with no flooding in the village. Commercial and Farm Vehicles



We have received complaints about and observed many incidents of commercial and farm vehicles driving inappropriately through the village. These are large / wide vehicles which often exceed the speed limits (especially the 20mph) and

approach narrow corners too fast for the road conditions considering the width of the vehicles.

Residents are encouraged to report commercial drivers who are not driving appropriately to the company concerned. So, where possible, note the date, time, nature of the driving event, company name and if possible reg number, etc. Ask the company to have a word with their drivers accordingly. Most businesses should act positively to this. The more of us that do this, the safer for all.

Let's Celebrate...

Why do we like to celebrate? Well why not?

It's a great way to share happiness with friends, to mark a special occasion - or even quietly on one's own at the end of the day to take stock and give thanks for the small things that have been uplifting or fun.

There are just so many opportunities for us to enjoy time with others: from public holidays such as the royal birthdays, seasonal holidays and the great Christian festivals of Christmas and Easter to family events and anniversaries, birthdays, weddings, graduations, new babies and homecomings. Then we have Mothers' Day and Fathers' Day.

We also organise reunions of school class mates or work groups or just a big gathering of friends for the sake of it.

People celebrate in a range of different ways, sometimes with a small collection of close friends or maybe by escaping to a quiet retreat. It is important, too, to recognise the small things each day that have been encouraging even in unlikely circumstances: these will often be personal and apparently commonplace and the celebration will probably be very low key, for instance just a quiet pause on one's own over a cup of tea. Some people are more ambitious and have a bucket list of activities, maybe a balloon trip or jumping out of an aeroplane!

Some events, such as birthdays, come round each year and act as a focus for families to contact a certain person, a father, grandparent or sister or brother. There will probably be a special cake with candles and presents. There might be a party or an outing but some sort of effort will be made for it to be memorable and fitting for the person concerned. These are valuable because they reinforce connections and bring people together even if it has to be by Zoom if they are living in different countries.

Other events such as exceptional anniversaries, silver weddings or a special birthday will only happen once in a lifetime so become more significant and may call for more planning and all the challenges of who to invite. They usually involve a wider circle of significant people as well as the extended family.

Then there are public events when there is a general celebration which can be affecting anyone in the country; such things as a royal birthday with rituals in Horse Guards Parade and marching down the Mall. On these occasions there is a general acknowledgement that it is a special day whether or not one personally is taking part.

There are one-offs such as winning the World Cup in a major sport when a section of the population will be enjoying a day out and maybe a team will drive through London in a double-decker bus.



Each of these occasions provides an opportunity to have fun, with or without friends. They are times when we might exchange memories with strangers, chance acquaintances or close family.

So, the real essence of celebration is not the balloons or the cake, the marching or the waving of flags, but the sharing that goes on between family, friends, acquaintances and strangers.

Churches are often the centre of important events and we also celebrate during our Sunday services with thanks and praise to God, reflected in our readings, prayers and music.... Here is one of the most famous of the Psalms (no 100) which captures that sharing of joy:

*Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth.
Serve the Lord with gladness;
come into his presence with singing
Know that the Lord is God.
It is he who made us, and we are his;
we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.
Enter his gates with thanksgiving
and his courts with praise.
Give thanks to him; bless his name.
For the Lord is good;
his steadfast love endures forever
and his faithfulness to all generations.*

Let us in our various ways try to make a joyful noise this summer and not forget to have a mini celebration at the end of each day in recognition of the smallest of triumphs and all that has been uplifting.
