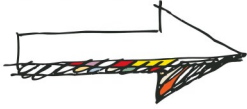

In response to residents letting us know that they have pre-loved items looking for new homes, Woodton village is going to be holding a garage sale on **6th September 2025!**



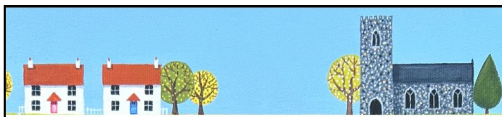

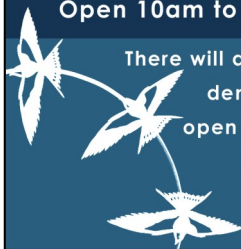

Thought for the month...

The swifts are back!

When we hear this and look up, we know that summer lies ahead.

We don't always see the swifts as they wheel impossibly high in the clear blue sky, but we hear their unmistakable scream as groups of them swoop overhead. The RSPB mentions other migrants that return to the UK in the summer months: in addition to swifts, there are sand martins, house martins, swallows,



ospreys and cuckoos.

Swifts fly 14,000 miles to Africa every autumn and back in the spring. Isn't that amazing? No hanging about in airports, no bookings or refunds for cancelled flights. They just press on regardless of hazards they meet as they pass over the Pyrenees.

Not only birds migrate: butterflies do too, these delicate creatures flying hundreds of miles, using the high currents of air.

Of course, people also have always migrated and continue to do so in their millions, usually in search of a better life, either fleeing from lack of opportunity or repressive regimes but at other times for less fundamental reasons. Just as migrating for the swifts entails many hazards and requires a lot of determination, so in large-scale human migrations there is a huge amount of risk and cost, driven in this case by strong individual self-belief that such action is necessary for their wellbeing.



Less traumatically, there are many who habitually travel to a favourite place on a regular basis every year. It could be to catch up with family members who have already migrated or in search of sunshine or to attend an event, perhaps a national celebration or a sporting activity.

We all frequently give ourselves challenges and make our lives unnecessarily complicated but this also brings rewards which we sometimes only fully appreciate as we look back on our own histories.

Although the old saying (attributed to Aristotle) states that “one swallow does not a summer make”, as we welcome migrant birds, summer really begins. At this time of year the days are long and light and there are lots of reasons to get outside.

We do our own small daily migration to the garden or the park, making the most of whatever opportunity there is. There is more likelihood of meeting neighbours and chatting over the garden fence, to feel part of a community.

So, as we listen to stories of journeys and new experiences, let us, like the swifts, enjoy the feeling of being a part of a community and express this privilege in whatever way suits us.

And let’s remember to look up to marvel at the swifts:

Swifts

The swifts winnow the air.	Or rip the silk of the wind
It is pleasant at the end of the day	In passing. Unseen ribbons
To watch them. I have shut my mind	Are trailing upon the air.
On fools. The phone’s frenzy	There is no solving the problem
Is over. There is only the swifts’	They pose. that had millions of years
Restlessness in the sky	Behind it. When the first thinker
And their shrill squealing	looked at them.
Sometimes they glide,	Sometimes they meet

In the high air; what is engendered
At contact? I am learning to bring
Only my wonder to the contemplation
of the geometry of their dark wings.
