
AUGUST GROUP

NOT the parish council. We encourage you to report all issues to NCC via its portal at <u>https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/highwaysproblem</u> NCC should deal with issues such as: overgrown surfaces, trees, bushes; damaged or missing signs; crops/ploughing; obstructions; bridges; animals etc.

Parents should be aware that we have noticed discarded vape cartridges on the playing field and children's play area. Please help protect your children by placing any cartridges you see in the bins provided and encourage anybody seen throwing them on the floor to use the bin.

Introducing BikeActive Norfolk

We are a disability, all inclusive, all ability cycling group who run sessions alternate Friday's from Topcroft Sports and Social Club, Topcroft.

We use our experience and our plethora of specialist cycles to give anyone a fun cycling experience whether they



have a disability of any nature, have lost confidence to cycle alone or are recovering from illness or injury that makes cycling difficult.

Our sessions run at 10:30/11:30/12:30hrs on our running days, and we ride about 3.5 miles along very quiet country roads at Topcroft at a very sedate 7 mph which takes about 45 minutes through beautiful countryside. Some of our clients can cycle alone on our low step cycles or trikes, others may need to be piloted on one of our tandem trikes or side by side trikes and some on our wheelchair tandems or wheelchair transporters.

We can take most anyone out cycling and have taken people out cycling with such diverse issues as learning disability, amputee, multiple sclerosis, stroke recovery, cerebral palsy, knee and hip replacement injuries and others who have just lost confidence to cycle alone. We never ask anyone's disability or problem although most people tell us. But if you want to come along and cycle, please do. We want people to experience the joy of cycling and have never failed to get anyone who attended out cycling.

Thought for the month...

Boats and The Isles of Scilly

Did you watch the kayaks, canoes and sailing boats at the Olympics? If so you will have been impressed by the power of water and the fickleness of the wind and how both of these impact on us mere humans.

This summer I [Jill] have spent a few days in the Isles of Scilly, where the sea is a permanent presence and boats take over from cars. There are five major islands and hundreds of lesser ones, in addition treacherous reefs and rocks abound. The churchyards are full of drowned men.



Boats are important in Norfolk on the Broads and rivers, too.

- You can have a trip on a wherry ...
- You can sail your own or hire one for the day...
- You can row or paddle your own canoe.

If you live on the island of Britain you can hop on a ferry to get across a river or the channel or to one of the many islands along the coast. You are conscious of being cut off from other countries but not of the sea as a constant presence unless you live on the edge.

But if you live on a little island a boat is a necessity: it's your link with other islands and the mainland. Your boat is more important than a car. It's what you need to meet friends, to get to the shops and access entertainment.

There is a very special emotion which comes with boarding a small boat and as you chug between adjacent islands the view is always changing, you are close to the water and very aware of sea birds and the amazing light over the waves.

You are also very conscious of your vulnerability, dependence on the weather and many things beyond your control.

On the way you are drawn to fellow travellers, some of whom do the trip daily or weekly and who can tell you about the life of those who live and work on the islands.

Reaching land and going ashore is another exciting experience made more special as you have to manage steep ladders and tricky landing stages.

In a sense this is a mirror of our lives with their many stages, most of which we sail through without really appreciating the experiences we enjoy.

Robert Louis Stevenson wrote, 'to travel hopefully is a better thing than to arrive' but I'm not entirely convinced. There is something very satisfying and comforting about arriving, feeling you've achieved, being welcomed and settling in, home safe and sound.

There is also a joy in welcoming others into our homes, or meeting them successfully at a rendezvous.

So let us give thanks for these gifts and savour the good moments as we look back on our experiences of the last days, weeks, months or years, the familiar as well as the unfamiliar.
