We can provide financial grants to those who need them. The Trust owns the Mill and Bar both of which are used to support the local community through lunch clubs, events and room hire in a listed building.



Do you teach, work with or simply spend time with young people and wish to have a better understanding of the signs and symptoms of poor mental health and importantly, how to promote positive mental health? Are you perhaps a parent who currently feels they lack the confidence, knowledge and skills to approach and start a conversation surrounding mental health with your child? Are you aware of what to look out for when it comes to depression, anxiety, self harm, disordered eating and even suicidal ideation?

Thought for the month...

Revisiting...

There is a lot made of new experiences, visiting different parts of the world, but many people enjoy going back to familiar places full of memories. Some return year after year, like migrating birds, to the same area, sometimes the same hotel, B and B or campsite. There is a certain kind of joy in retracing one's steps, of reconnecting with the past even if, in a restless world, we hear less about the value of sameness.



I have recently returned to Exmoor where I spent a lot of my childhood and have subsequently spent many holidays there with my own children. Luckily as a protected area it hasn't change substantially, though the sawmill which had lapsed has now been restored and is busy working again.

There were memories of walks by the rivers and long hikes on the moor but this time with different people the distances covered were much smaller and we shared different memories of the people who used to live in the villages and farms.

Sometimes returns are tinged with sadness or regrets but they can also revive memories of good times, funny incidents or of people we had forgotten about.

Going back can be revealing in a number of ways. Sometimes the place has changed and we haven't; on other occasions the place has not changed but we have. We have had new experiences, have grown older, if not necessarily wiser, and see the place through new eyes.

Memory will vary, too, for people of different generations as age influences the depth of the stored material.

Different people will have a range of memories and perceptions of the same event which is one of the pleasures of reminiscing with former colleagues or siblings.

This new look will affect us when we contemplate other experiences, reread a book or watch a film or play again. In the fast-moving world of the internet it can also be valuable to replay in our minds recent encounters or messages that have unsettled us before responding.

There are some memories that are too painful to revisit. This was highlighted recently by VJ events marking the 80th anniversary of this historic event within living memory.

So, as we revisit places or replay conversations and encounters, may we find a value in pealing back the layers of memory and allow the benefit of hindsight to give these experiences the richness of a further dimension.
